Treasurer's Report—Deb Stemen

•Concessions are doing well. We brought in \$7,623.02 for the 8/31 Varsity Football game, and an additional \$4,936.07 from the Varsity Football game on 9/7/18. Soccer games have brought in \$2,793.69, with one game rained out.

•The final trip payment was made to Bob Rogers Travel.

Assistant Treasurer's Report—Marla Becker

•Since last we met, band and orchestra families have purchased \$10,100 in Giant Eagle and Kohl's gift cards, earning \$505 for student trip accounts. There was one flocking order as well. •This enabled a fundraising payment of \$537.50 to be sent to Bob Rogers toward the final New York band trip payment due Friday. (The difference from the \$505 number above is plus flocking, minus orchestra student gift card purchases.) Thank you to the band directors for setting the August 31 deadline for gift card purchases to be applied to the final trip payment; that was very helpful in getting balances settled and submitted on time.

•Current Trip account balances total \$1543.15 in student accounts and \$2802.05 in the General Trip Fund.

Director's Reports

Mrs. Ballard—Middle School East Band Not Present Mr. Bradshaw—Middle School South Band Not Present

•The GMSS bands are off and running for the school year. The 8th grade band has 41 students. We have spent our time so far reviewing concepts from 7th grade, learning about the form and characteristics of a march, and sight reading music. The students are getting used to completing recorded playing assessments instead of playing live for the class.

•The 7th grade band has 60 members and has been reviewing concepts from last year as well. The overall sound of the 7th grade band is more "mature" sounding than is usual for this grade level, and that is exciting to hear!

•The 6th grade students are in the middle of Music Survey, where they are learning about each music class offering before selecting their music class for the year. MSS has around 70 fitting appointments scheduled, and I'm sure that more will be scheduled in the next few days. This is a tiny bit smaller of a number for 6th grade band to start at South lately, but that is to be expected with the redistricting that happened over the summer to reduce the number of students in the building.

•The 7th grade music classes will be attending the OSU Musical Celebration Concert on November 30. I would like to ask that GLIMB provide the cost of the tickets for our band students to attend this event. •Thank you for your continued support of our programs!

Mr. Cebriak—Lincoln High School bands

•Since last we met...

•Thanks to everyone—chaperones, uniform parents, cookie makers, concession workers—for a great start to the year!

•We have been purchasing books, and getting uniforms ready for 81 freshmen: thanks for helping us to purchase the books and shirts (for which they are reimbursing GLIMB). There are instrumentation issues (14 percussionists for instance). We are working on skill building and getting ready for the October concert.

•Coming up...

•This Friday we are away at New Albany for the combined patriotic show: 3:30 dress, 3:45 load, 4:00 depart. We will rehearse around 4:30 and then eat before the game. They are serving pizza and salad from Bellacino's, for which we are reimbursing them with the money collected for this purpose from uniform fees.

•Alumni night is Homecoming, September 21. More will be posted on the website soon. We would like to do meal coupons for all of our alumni again.

Mr. Dengel-Lincoln High School orchestras, Middle School East Orchestra

•On August 17, I shared with the Chamber Orchestra that they were selected to perform at the 2019 Ohio Music Education Association (OMEA) Professional Development Conference in Cleveland. It is the first time the orchestra program has submitted an application and recording, and we are excited to represent Gahanna's K-12 music programs alongside Jazz 1! Our performance time is 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, February 2. We are in the midst of planning the trip – which includes an overnight stay.

•On Friday, August 24, the HS orchestras had their annual fall movie night. We enjoyed *The Avengers: Infinity War* and appreciated the chaperones with us that evening.

•Our representative from Cousin's Concert Attire visited on August 27 to measure sophomores. Those orders will arrive in the next couple of weeks. The \$500 in GLIMB earmarked funds will provide a discount for the students who will use these throughout high school.

•Last Thursday, September 6, we held our Beginning Orchestra Informational Meeting. More than 100 families were present with lots of excitement amongst interested students. Instruments must be secured by September 24 with classes beginning the following week.

•We have made reservations for the eighth grade to attend the Columbus Symphony Orchestra's Young People's Concert in February, in addition to the seventh grade band, orchestra, choir, and ESS students to attend the OSU Celebration Concert in November. Invoices forthcoming.

•Lastly, Mrs. Ross will be performing with the Columbus Symphony Orchestra for their season opening night ("In Full Splendor") on September 21 and 22. We hope to get a group of students to attend this concert.

Mr. Kinser—Middle School South Orchestra Not Present

Mr. Miller-Middle School West Band, Lincoln High School Silver Band

•Bands at Middle School West are into the routine of a new school year, and we are moving past the beginning-of-the-year paperwork, money collection, and classroom rules. 7th grade band is experimenting with a new electronic practice log and using a school-owned text to review concepts from 6th grade band. The 8th grade band has learned how to make recordings with their Chromebooks and are making good progress as a full band. Both groups are now beginning to read music for their first performances of the year. Thanks to GLIMB for providing a few new books to supplement the 7th grade review set, as well as facilitating the purchase of reimbursable items like uniform shirts and band books. •6th grade music survey classes are getting a chance to try brass instruments in class this week, as we wrap up the 4-week presentation of band instruments and prepare for instrument fitting appointments to begin next week. Turnout at our parent information meeting last week was higher than it has been in the last few years, and we currently have 175 students with confirmed appointments, along with quite a few more who have expressed interest but have not scheduled a fitting at this time.

•6th grade fitting appointments take place in the high school band room after school on September 18, 20, and 24. There are also some fittings occurring next week during the school day at each middle school.

•Middle school bands have their first concert performances on Thursday, November 1 (8th grade) and Monday, November 5 (7th grade). Both concerts will be at Middle School West and will start at 7:30. GLIMB is welcome to pass out literature or set up a table for spiritwear at these events, and we will also have a commission fund jar available for donations (the current 7th graders will be part of that project next school year). Thanks for all you do!

Ms. Ross-Middle School West Orchestra

•31 students in 7th grade will attend Celebration Concert at OSU with all 7th grade music students in the district.

14 students in 8th grade will attend CSO Young People's Concert with students from MSS and MSE.
New method books are being distributed to 7th grade students and polo shirts are being ordered.

•More than 100 families turned out for the beginning strings meetings with many requests still coming in from students.

•I've approached some students to see if they will switch from violin to viola for balance in future Freshman Orchestra.

•Request funds to rent some violas short-term, they are about \$30 apiece for three or four months (we need four). Rent to own? Thank you!

[Glimb discussion: Let's explore buying four violas. Mr. Dengel and Ms. Ross to get information.]

•Jazz Band auditions will begin on Monday, September 17. The rhythm section will begin the following week with Jazz I's first rehearsal being October 1.

Concession Report—Jim Slates

•Two football games in the books. Everyone is doing a great job.

•I'm trying to get used to the way Coke does things. No confirmation on when we'll get bigger coolers. Coke is not giving us a warning or head's up when not delivering product. We have to always check the invoice against what they give us very closely. Deliveries are on Thursdays. Volunteers need to check off quantities before they put it away.

Hospitality Report—Nicki Stamas Not Present

•Mr. Cebriak: "Thanks to Hospitality for getting all the food together for picture night."

Uniform Report—Bryon Marusek

•We had three days of fittings (we were rushed at the end). Since fitting weekend, we've had nine late fittings, altered 28 uniforms, repaired a dozen coats and jackets, and put together 27 belts (we only have two extras).

•We got most of the brass back from Tyler Teegardin: it looks fantastic, like new!

•The uniform team got 187 kids into uniforms, then out of uniforms and back into summer uniforms Friday for picture night. We had one emergency fitting for picture night.

•I talked to Dwight at Stanbury about new belts: they are \$59.50 each (without buckles), so \$14,400 to outfit the band. It will take six months to get them in after they're ordered.

•Mr. Cebriak: We replaced all the belts five years ago and they didn't last very well (and they were some \$40 apiece).

•I'm getting a firm quote for the new Drum Major uniform. We will get the new uniform for next year's marching band season if we order by January.

•The new laptop is here and I'm working on loading it with software. Right now we have about \$400 invested in it and the software.

Volunteer Report—Deborah Bowles

•The volunteer form on Google Docs has been wonderful! We had 358 families fill out the form, including 84 orchestra families.

•I have Google docs for menus, booth captain checklist, etc....

•Mandi Shirley is willing to do spiritwear again this year.

•Chi Carlucci has been awesome, stepping up and helping out wherever and whenever she's needed.

•I'm concerned about this Saturday because of Tag Day, soccer, and freshman football. I'm also concerned about the day of the Buckeye Invitational: there are a lot of games (all day) and we still need help.

•At Homecoming we'll be training new people and booth captains.

•Stonybrook Methodist volunteers will work in the booths for Senior Night (October 26).

•We'll need four chaperones per bus (10 uniform parents) for the Buckeye Invitational.

•Thanks to the directors for getting out the SOS for volunteers.

New Business

•Mr. Dengel: Tag Day

•We need more drivers. I split some routes based on what happened last year, so we need 36 more drivers. We need a driver push: email from the volunteer coordinator and the directors. There are 82 routes in total now.

•The photos on the Glimb web site are two and three years old: Mr. Dengel, Dave Prater and Kristine Gross-Squillante to work on updates.

•Mr. Cebriak: We have a student who would like reimbursement for year-round and summer camp.
•Check and find out how much was given last year: give the same flat amount that was given last year? Agree to give \$300 (\$100 per camp).

Old Business

•The new PA system was purchased for \$3077.00. Every marching band director is on a wireless microphone and we have two speakers so the kids can hear the director's instructions. We're going to get a lot of money's worth out of the system.
